Welcome

Despite recent Government funding cuts, PE and School Sport in Liverpool continues to grow and 2011/12 promises to be yet another “active year”, with the 2012 Olympics & values at the heart of everything we do.

As you know 2010/11 was a difficult year for the partnership with the Government cutting funding to the National Strategy. For the Liverpool South Central School Sport Partnership our main concern was the demise of all the good work over the past 8 years. We know when schools and partners work together so much more can be achieved for the young people living in our City. We want our young people to have every sporting opportunity they can, in the hope that they may continue in sport or physical activity in the future, whatever their chosen level.

Over the last 12 months, we have worked hard consulting head teachers from primary, special and secondary schools to determine what their needs are and what services we need to offer. It has allowed us to rethink who we are, what we do and re-shape the LSC SSP. It was clear that schools still wanted us to work with their teachers and to get as many young people aged 5-19 yrs taking part in high quality PE lessons, extracurricular activities and community sport.

With the growing problem of obesity and the recent launch of the Physical Activity Guidelines from the Chief Medical Officers in July 2011, there is still much more to achieve. This year with LSSP support, schools and young people will have access to a diverse range of activities including:

- A specialist coaching programme to help schools cover PPA time.
- A full competition programme at cluster, partnership and city wide level feeding into the National School Games framework.
- Support for lunchtime organisers, young leaders, volunteers & coaches.
- A full CPD programme with reduced places for LSSP schools
- A range of cross curricular activities and;
- Access to a variety of community activities and clubs.

Physical activity guidelines for

CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE (5–18 YEARS)



1. All children and young people should engage in moderate to vigorous intensity physical activity for at least 60 minutes and up to several hours every day.
2. Vigorous intensity activities, including those that strengthen muscle and bone, should be incorporated at least three days a week.
3. All children and young people should minimise the amount of time spent being sedentary (sitting) for extended periods.

Individual physical and mental capabilities should be considered when interpreting the guidelines.

Examples of physical activity that meet the guidelines

Moderate intensity physical activities will cause children to get warmer and breathe harder and their hearts to beat faster, but they should still be able to carry on a conversation. Examples include:

- Bike riding
- Playground activities

Vigorous intensity physical activities will cause children to get warmer and breathe much harder and their hearts to beat rapidly, making it more difficult to carry on a conversation. Examples include:

- Fast running
- Sports such as swimming or football

Physical activities that strengthen muscle and bone involve using body weight or working against a resistance. Examples include:

- Swinging on playground equipment
- Hopping and skipping
- Sports such as gymnastics or tennis

Minimising sedentary behaviour may include:

- Reducing time spent watching TV, using the computer or playing video games
- Breaking up sedentary time such as swapping a long bus or car journey for walking part of the way

What are the benefits of being active for at least 60 minutes each day?

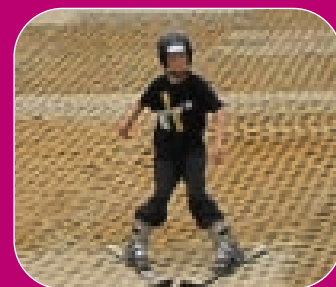
- Improves cardiovascular health
- Maintains a healthy weight
- Improves bone health
- Improves self-confidence
- Develops new social skills

JUNIOR SPORTS LEADER AWARD (LEADERSHIP & VOLUNTEERING)

Over the last year 10 pupils have completed the Level One Sports Leaders Award, with a number of these pupils now studying Sports related courses in local Colleges. This is a tremendous achievement for some of our pupils who before the course started lacked self confidence.

DISABILITY SWIMMING GALAS

Aigburth High participated in three different swimming galas throughout the year. We pride ourselves on teaching swimming to all pupils with swimming being a vital fixture on the PE timetable. We gained various gold, silver and bronze medals during these events. Pupils were also invited to a swimming gala held at a Calderstones school for less able swimmers. Pupils were engaged in fun games and short distance swims to help improve their overall confidence in the water.

BASKETBALL

Ten pupils from Aigburth High were invited to take part in an after school basketball club run by Mersey Tigers at Woolton High School. Pupils were coached for 8 weeks by basketball coaches from Mersey Tigers Basketball Club. This was brilliant experience for our pupils and it really improved their overall skill levels.



SEN PE FORUM

Once again throughout this current academic year the SEN forum has continued to thrive. The forum has put on a variety of events for students attending Liverpool Special Schools. Once again a big thank you to everyone who took part in events, with a special mention to Faye Parsons and Paul O Leary for helping organise the events.

SPORTS FAYRE

To help develop links with local sports clubs pupils from Aigburth High School took part in a rotation of different sports such as Dodgeball, Basketball, Rugby, Cricket, Boxing, Kayaking and Skiing during our School Fayre day. LEADERSHIP ACADEMY

22 Year 10 pupils have attended Leadership training this year, developing their confidence and skills to become Young Leaders with a Sports Leaders Level 1 qualification. The pupils have undertaken various roles whilst completing their qualification such as: leading lunchtime games on the Year 7 yard, acting as mentors, supporting the KS3 sports teams and assisting staff within the extra curricular programme. As part of their course leaders ran an 'Intra-form Activity Week' for Year 7's which was a huge success. Leaders have also worked hard running and hosting the 'Intra Cluster Games' which happens each term. Well done and congratulations to all our Young Leaders.

ROWING

Rowing has been a big hit with Years 9-11 this year, with 35 pupils involved in partnership and regional coaching sessions and competitions. Bellerive FCJ entered 2 indoor competitions, and despite no formal training managed to hold their own and even win a couple of heats. The group has also had the opportunity to experience rowing on the open water with sessions at the Watersports Centre in the Albert Dock. It is hoped that we will continue to row and enter some water based competitions.

PREMIER LEAGUE FOR SPORT AND LIVERPOOL FOOTBALL CLUB

Volleyball is a new sport that has been introduced to pupils at Bellerive this year. The club began with coaching sessions from Tony Westman through Premier League for Sport funding and has attracted pupils from Years 7 & 8. Bellerive now has 2 teams at U12 and U13 level who will be entering competitions in the near future.

INTRA CLUSTER GAMES

This year saw the second year of the Intra-Cluster games played between the Bellerive FCJ Catholic College Cluster Schools St Clares, Holy Family and St Patricks. The aim of the cluster games is to give pupils the opportunity to compete in alternative games which sit outside the usual competition structure. HEALTH WEEK

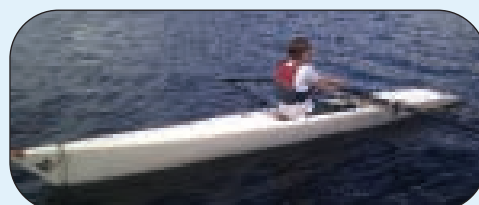

It has been another successful year for The Belvedere Academy within the Liverpool School Sport Partnership. Many more young people have benefited from coaching, competitions, leadership experiences and activity trips.



SPORT UNLIMITED

The Belvedere Academy has benefited greatly from Sport Unlimited funding which has enabled Belvedere girls to get professional rugby coaching from RU@ School. A selection of rugby coaches came into the school to give fitness and technique sessions to the pupils. All of the girls thoroughly enjoyed the variety of activities they tried.

As a continuation of last year's success in Basketball coaching, Mersey Tigers ran a block of coaching sessions again for pupils in years 7-13.

Sports Unlimited Dance sessions take place weekly with Jenny Morris. The new dance studio has been put to good use with up to 30 pupils attending sessions. Jenny has choreographed dance routines which have been showcased in School performances. We hope to sustain this in 2012- 2012.

PREMIER LEAGUE FOR SPORT AND LIVERPOOL FOOTBALL CLUB

Tony Westman who has a background in coaching the Danish Womens Volleyball team has hosted intensive volleyball coaching sessions at Belvedere each Friday evening since January. 20 girls ranging from years 9-13 have been attending each week. Pupils have benefited greatly from Tony's expertise and have greatly improved their skill levels. Tony along with Stephen Park and Brian Kendall hosted a Volleyball tournament in Sefton Park with 10 teams entering. Belvedere entered 4 teams and came 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 8th overall.

STEP INTO SPORT

The Youth Sport Trust Step into Sport Volunteer scheme has proved immensely popular this year with the whole of the year 10 GCSE class having been involved. Pupils have volunteered within the community, at Belvedere and within local primary schools. Young Leaders also helped organise and run a Cluster competition during National School Sports Week for primary schools within the Belvedere Cluster.

Belvedere has been successful in securing funding from HSBC and the GDST to continue developing the leadership opportunities at Belvedere next year.

CLUSTER EVENTS

The Belvedere Cluster of primary schools; St Anthony of Padua, Our Lady of Good Help, Carleton House and Belvedere Prep came together at The Belvedere Academy in November for a cluster Netball coaching clinic and tournament ran by the young leaders. The Cluster Indoor athletics event took place at Belvedere where Young Leaders helped to run the events, record results and judge the different disciplines. The competition was tough but Carleton House came out on top and went through to the next round. Key Steps Gymnastics also ran at Belvedere with young leaders assisting with warming up the competitors, judging the events and taking photos. To conclude a successful year National School Sports Week saw a Belvedere Cluster Activity afternoon held at Belvedere Prep, where each of the schools brought a mixed team of 15 pupils to take part in a hockey, football and netball tournaments as well as a hoola hoopathon which lasted 37 minutes.

PRIMARY SCHOOLS

CARLETON HOUSE

The LSSP coaching delivered in curriculum and extracurricular time by Karen Quinn this year has without doubt been beneficial to the children. Karen has been punctual, hardworking and great with the children. The children have really enjoyed the sessions she has delivered this year.

Similarly the children have thoroughly enjoyed taking part in LSSP organised competitions and cluster events. Children from Years 3 - Year 6 have taken part in lots of competitions including: football tournaments at Thomas Lane playing fields and Childwall Sports College; Indoor Athletics (South Central Winners); Primary School Cross Country races; Basketball; Cluster group Netball and Liverpool Swimming Finals. During the summer term pupils also took part in Athletics and Tri Golf.

PRIMARY SCHOOLS

PRINCES PRIMARY

Princes Primary school caters for children with severe learning difficulties, including physical disabilities and we have a strong ethos on physical development. During the past year the LSSP has supported our work by providing sports coaches who work with different classes supporting Princes Park staff, to ensure each child gets the most from their PE lesson.

Young leaders came in to coach football and cheerleading to KS2 which children on every level were able to access. We also had a dance teacher come in and work with a two high ability classes to create a dance routine that was shown to the whole school during a school assembly.

Having external coaches come into the school supports PSHE and helps the pupils develop their communication skills.

YOUNG LEADERS PROGRAMME

Broadgreen International School prides itself on their young leaders programme. This year there were 16 dance leaders, 10 football leaders and 6 multi sports leaders coaching in a variety of settings such as: the community; primary schools; and local sports clubs. Young leaders also supported the running of the Kensington Youth Games.

TABLE TENNIS AND PREMIER LEAGUE FOR SPORT

Broadgreen International School linked up with Everton football club and the Premier League for Sport programme to develop table tennis after being out of the curriculum for a few years. On Wednesday 15th June 2011 Broadgreen International School hosted yet another outstanding Dance production at the Contemporary Urban Arts Centre, with over 300 pupils involved. The show included performances from several feeder primary schools; Broadgreen Primary, Kensington Juniors, Newpark Primary, Blueberry Park and St Anne Stanley. Broadgreen community dance club also took to the stage for their first performance as a group. The show was a sell out with 450 staff, parents and pupils attending. The pupils involved in the performance showed great levels of determination and the final production was a credit to their hard work.

SPORTS FAYRE

Broadgreen held their annual Sports Fayre inviting 12 local clubs from the area into the school. Year 7 & 8 pupils spent the day experiencing the different activities on offer from Thai boxing to Dance. Getting pupils to join local clubs is a big priority for Broadgreen, to not only develop opportunities for all but to increase pupils' skills and the likelihood of long term participation.

SPORTS AWARDS EVENING

On Wednesday 22nd June 2011 Broadgreen International School hosted their Annual Sports Awards evening to celebrate the outstanding achievements of over 250 pupils from both primary and secondary schools within the cluster. King David Primary: Mosspsits: Rudston Infants and Juniors

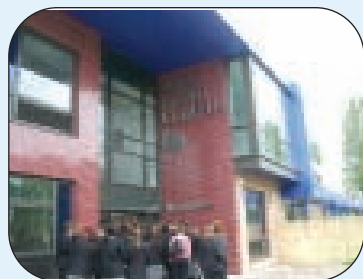
KING DAVID

King David HS has had a challenging year but on reflection can still celebrate many satisfying achievements from both team and individual performances. Pupils have achieved success in a range of the regular LSSP competitions they compete in, including table-tennis, badminton and indoor athletics and have been particularly successful in the new tennis competition hosted by Palmerston Tennis Club.

The building of the new King David Campus has meant that sports facilities have been very limited but thanks to the support of Childwall Sports College and Liverpool Hope University, many

activities and events have continued to take place. The PE department are looking forward to moving into the campus to enjoy the new sports facilities including a sports hall.

Supported by grants from Sports Unlimited, Bridgefield Waterpolo Club, Liverpool Junior Fencing Club and Palmeston Tennis Club have all taken sessions at King David to encourage pupils to try new sports and offer the opportunity to join local clubs. YOUNG LEADERS

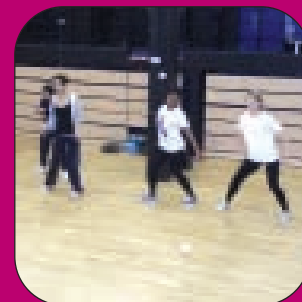

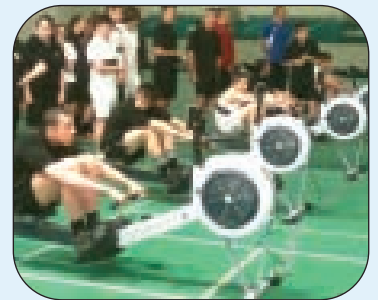


St Margaret's Cluster

They lead a wide variety of sports, many relating to the competitions available through LSSP. Coaches support schools with their cluster competitions, lead challenging sessions for selected gifted & talented children in schools as well as training young leaders to deliver small group games during lunch times.

Last year the LSSP also secured funding from the Extended Schools budget to set up community sports sessions. SC SSP have used Childwall Sports Centre to run a multi- sports club and gymnastic club. The sessions have been led by the SSP coaches and have been available for pupils in KS 1 & KS 2. The gymnastic club has been very popular and opportunities to sustain it next year are being pursued.

School Sport funding has faced significant changes in 2011 and as a result, funding for coaches has been withdrawn. This means that the coach team will be reduced to cover requests from schools who have subscribed to the coaching package on offer. 2010-11 may have proved to be a challenging year for school sport but nevertheless, there was still plenty of activity and as always plenty of successes.

All sports from 2009-10 were retained on the competition programme last year, in all there were 19 competitive opportunities for schools to take part in. Performances of note came from St Michaels in the Hamlet who for the second year running represented South Central LSSP at the County Indoor Athletics Final after winning the City Finals, however unlike last year they were not crowned champions, though they did finish in a respectable 4th place. The school were also this year’s SSP Y3/4 Indoor Athletics winners!

National School Sport Week 2011 in the Liverpool South Central SSP

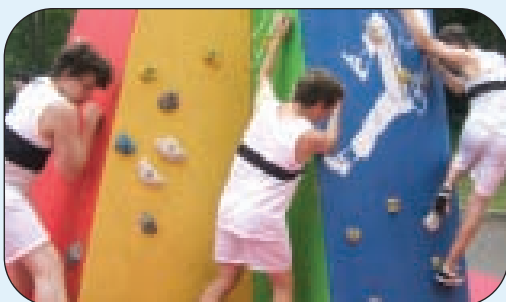
A very big thank you to all of our schools that took part in the Lloyds TSB National School Sport Week and helped make it an amazing success.
